
Prepare to place the TV with the display side down on a flat surface. Due to the size and weight of this TV, the use of 2 people is recommended when moving it. Ensure the table or desk you use provides a flat, totally clean surface, and use a soft cloth between the face of the TV and the table to protect the TV's screen.

1. Locate the 2PCS of the base stand and insert it into the gap in the bottom of the TV , and check that it is securely held in place as per a) below.





 $\ensuremath{\text{2.Lock}}\xspace 4$ screws in the designated location as per b) below and check each screw is firmly tightened.




A wall mount kit (purchased separately) would allow you to mount your JVC TV on the wall. For detailed information on installing the wall mount, refer to the instructions provided by the wall mount manufacturer. It is strongly recommended to contact a technician for professional assistance for wall mount installation. JVC is not responsible for any damage to the product or injury to yourself or others resulting from the wall-mounting.



This JVC TV is compatible with a 100mm x 100mm mounting hole pattern.

- 4 pcs of type M4 screws are required for installing the wall mount bracket to your JVC TV. Do not use screws that are longer than 5 mm. Screws that are too long may cause damage to the inside of the TV set.
- Do not fasten the screws too tight for this may damage the TV or cause the TV to fall, resulting in personal injury. JVC is not liable for these kinds of incidents.
- Do not mount your JVC TV at more than a 15 degree tilt.







Antenna connection

Antenna input impedance of this unit is 75ohm. VHF/UHF 75ohm coaxial cable can be connected to the antenna jack directly, if the antenna cable is 300ohm parallel flat feeder cable, you need to use the 300ohm/75ohm converter to connect the antenna cable to the antenna jack. For details Please refer to the following drawing.



Connecting VCR

These instructions assume that you have already connected your TV to an antenna or a cable TV system. Skip step 1 if you have not yet connected to an antenna or a cable system.



Follow the instructions in Viewing a VCR or Camcorder Tape to view your VCR tape. Each VCR has a different back panel configuration.

When connecting a VCR, match the color of the connection terminal to the cable.

1. Unplug the cable or antenna from the back of the TV.

2. Connect the cable or antenna to the ANT IN terminal on the back of the VCR.

3. Connect an RF Cable between the ANT OUT terminal on the VCR and the ANT IN terminal on the TV.

4. Connect a Component Cable between the COMPONENT [Y, Pb, Pr] jacks on the DVD player and YPbPr jack on the TV.

5. Connect Audio Cables between the AUDIO OUT jacks on the VCR and the AUDIO L and AUDIO R jacks on the TV.



Connecting a **Camcorder**

The rear panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a camcorder to your TV. They allow you to view the camcorder tapes without using a VCR.

Each Camcorder has a different back panel configuration. When connecting a Camcorder or DVD, match the color of the connection terminal to the cable.




- 1. Connect a Video Cable between the AV VIDEO in jacks on the TV and the VIDEO OUT jack on the camcorder.
- 2. Connect Audio Cables between the AUDIO L and AUDIO R jacks on the TV and the AUDIO OUT jacks on the camcorder.
- 3. Connect a Video Cable between the AV VIDEO IN jacks on the TV and the VIDEO OUT jack on the DVD.
- 4. Connect Audio Cables between the component IN AUDIO L and R jacks on the TV and the AUDIO OUT jack on the DVD.

Notes:

- 1. Whenever you connect an external device to your TV, make sure that power on the unit is turned off.
- 2. When connecting an external device, match the color of the connection terminal to the cable.

Connecting Digital Audio System

This connection can only be made if there is a HDMI Output connector on the external device.



What is HDMI?

HDMI, or high-definition multimedia interface, is a next-generation interface that enables the transmission of digital audio and video signals using a single cable without compression. Multimedia interface is a more accurate name for it especially because it allows multiple channels of digital audio.

The difference between HDMI and DVI is that the HDMI device is smaller in size, has the HDCP (High Bandwidth Digital Copy Protection) coding feature installed, and supports multi-channel digital audio.

Each DVD player/STB has a different back panel configuration.

Connect an HDMI Cable between the HDMI1, HDMI2, HDMI3 connector on the TV and the HDMI connector on the DVD player/Set-Top Box.



Connecting Digital Audio

The rear panel jacks on your TV make it easy to connect a Digital Audio System to your TV.



5.1 CH audio is possible when the TV is connected to an external device supporting 5.1 CH. Connect an OPTICAL Cable between the OPTICAL jacks on the TV and the Digital Audio Input jacks on the Digital Audio System. When a Digital Audio System is connected to the OPTICAL terminal: Decrease the gain (volume) of the TV, and adjust the volume level with the Digital Audio System's volume control.

Menu Operation

1. PICTURE MENU

In this menu, you can adjust the picture effect here, such as contrast, brightness, etc. Press ▼▲ to select, press ENTER to adjust.

* Only under TV source, menu will show ⁽²⁾, Under AV/Component/HDMI1/HDMI2/HDMI3/ VGA/USB, menu will not show ⁽²⁾,



Note: The TV may not conform to the Energy Star standard after Picture Mode is changed except Energy Saving.

1.1 VGA Setting

When PC Mode is available. Press ENTER button to select PC advanced setting

1) H-Pos: Adjust the horizontal position of the screen.

2) V-Pos: Adjust the vertical position of the screen.

3) Size: Fine tune the screen width.

4) Phase: Fine tune the phase of the screen.

Úsually don't adjust this item.

5) Auto: Auto adjust to fit the screen.



Note:

1) If you want to adjust contrast, brightness, color, and sharpness, the picture mode must return to personal status.

2) Tint is avaliable in NTSC system only.3) There are three color temperature modes can be selected: Normal, Warm and Cool.

2.AUDIO MENU

In this menu, you can ajust the sound effect here. Press $\checkmark \blacktriangle$ to select, press ENTER to adjust.



Note:

1) There are five Sound Modes can be selected:Standard,Music,Movie,Sports and Personal

2) Audio language is available in ATSC/TV Programming only.

3) Auto volume is available only when the input signal volume is too large or there is distortion.

3. TIME MENU

In this menu, you can adjust the sleep timer, time zone, etc. Press $\checkmark \triangle$ to select, press ENTER to adjust.



Note:

1) Time zone, DST and the clock are available in ATSC programming only, and the Clock can't be adjust.

4.OPTION MENU

In this menu, you can adjust the Menu language, Close Caption, Restore Default etc.Press ♥▲ to select,press ENTER to adjust.





7.4 Press $\blacksquare \blacktriangle \blacksquare$ to select Photo, and then press enter



7.5 Press $\checkmark \land \checkmark \checkmark$ to select folder which contains JPEG picture .



7.6 Press ENTER to dispay the picture in the folder.



Troubleshooting

If you have any problem, check the couter measures for each symptom listed below. The following symptoms may have been. caused by inappropriate adjustment rather than actual malfunction of the unit. If the trouble persists, contact the Customer Care Centre, see back page for contact details.

Symptoms	Possible solutions
No power	Please check the power cord plugged in and that the power outlet works. Unplug the power cord and plug it in after 60 seconds and restart the TV.
No picture	Please check antenna connection. Station may be experiencing problems, please tune to another station. Please adjust the settings of contrast and brightness.
Good picture but no sound	Please increase the volume. Please check TV is under mute mode, press MUTE button on the remote control. Please check sound settings If external devices are being used, check their volumes are not set too low or turned off. If using AVI or Component inputs, please make sure cables are connected properly and not loose.
Good sound but abnormal color or no picture	Please check antenna connection and antenna condition. If using Component input, please check Component connections, incorrect or loose connections may cause colour problems or cause the screen to be blank.
No response to remote control	Batteries of remote control may have exhausted, if necessary, please change the batteries. Clean the remote control lens. The distance between LED TV and remote control should be within 8m, within recommended operating angle and path is free of obstructions.
Colored dots may be present on the screen	Although the LED screen is made with high-precision technology and 99.99% or more of the pixels are effective, black dots may appear or bright points of light (red, blue, or green) may appear constantly on the LED screen. This is a structural property of the LED screen and not a malfunction.
Picture is breaking up	Keep the TV away from noisy electrical sources such as cars, hair dryers, welders, and all optional equipment. Electrical atmospheric interference such as local or distant lightning storms may cause picture to break up. When installing optional equipment, leave some space between the optional equipment and the TV. Check the antenna and connection. Keep the antenna away from any power or input/output cables.
After Auto Tuning only some channels are available	Check your area is covered by Digital Video Broadcasts. Try re-tuning or manually tuning missing channels. Check that you are using the correct antenna type - please see pg.16 'Antenna connection'.

Troubleshooting

Channel cannot be selected	Check if the channel has been blocked in the main menu settings.
USB not playing	Please check connecting USB cable and power supply is connected. Hard drive has not been formatted. Please make sure USB disk is compatible and the multimedia data formats are supported.
Picture is distorted, macroblock, small block, dots, pixelization, etc	Compression of video contents may cause distortion especially on fast moving pictures such as sports and action movies.
Noise from speaker	Check cable connections, make sure a video cable is not connected to an audio input. Low signal level may cause sound distortion.
TV turns on automatically	Check if the On Timer is set to On in the Setup menu.
Picture is not shown in full screen	Black bars on each side will be shown on HD channels when displaying SD (4:3) contents. Black bars on Top & Bottom will be shown on movies that have aspect ratios different from your TV. Adjust picture size option on your external device or TV to full screen.

WARNING

Never place a television set in an unstable location. A television set may fall, causing serious personal injury or death. Many injuries, particularly to children, can be avoided by taking simple precautions such as:

The plug or appliance coupler is used as the disconnect device, the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.

Picture defects and the reason



Snowy Picture

Snowy picture is usually due to weak signal. Adjust antenna or install an antenna amplifier.



Double Image or Ghosts

Double images are usually caused by reflections from tall buildings. Adjust the direction of the antenna or raise it.



Radio Wave Interference

Wave patterns are moving on the screen, which are usually caused by nearby radio transmitters or shortwave receiving equipment.



High Temperature Electrothermal Interference

Diagonal or herringbone patterns appear on the screen or part of picture is missing. This is probably caused by high temperature electrothermal equipment in a nearby hospital.
